All items must be made from scratch and not from a mix. All items must be baked by the individual entering it and must be baked and cooled completely. Entries should be displayed on a disposable plate in a sealed gallon bag

(Exception: cakes and pies may be wrapped in clear wrap.)

The Award(s) criteria are:

Bronze level:	Kids (Ages 5-14): 50 – 74 hours Young Adults (15 -25): 100 -174 hours
Silver level	Kids (Ages 5-14) 75 – 99 hours Young Adults (15 -25): 100 -174 hours
Gold level	Kids (Ages 5-14) 100 or more hours Young Adults (15 -25): 250 or more hours

Anyone wishing to participate and be recognized at Achievement Night needs to notify Cynthia so you can make sure you are using the appropriate form to record your hours. All forms are due by **December 30, 2013**.
